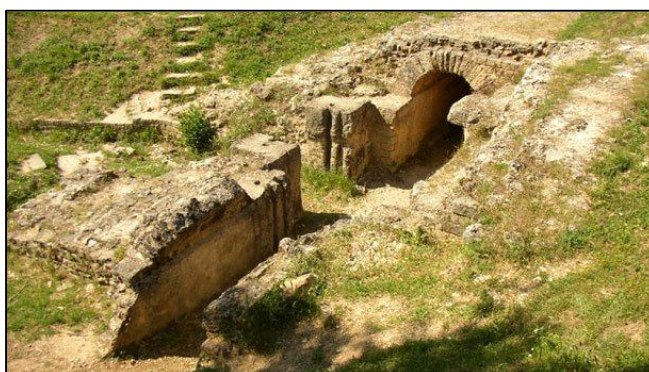
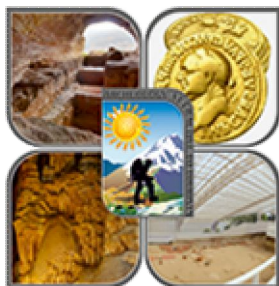
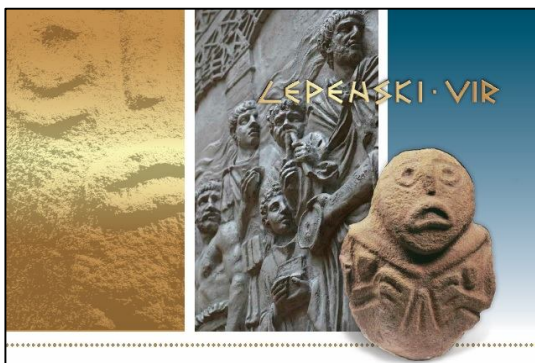

Project description:

The project envisioned and achieved the following results:

- Procurement and installation of Heating, Ventilation and Cooling (HVAC) system in Tourist Visitor Centre in Lepenski Vir, enabling extension of touristic season from 8 to 11 months;
- One new, fully equipped Visitor Centre in Dimovo is established;
- Organization of permanent exhibition and presentation of archaeological heritage in Visitors Centre in Dimovo – renovation and furnishing of the building for the Visitors Centre, selection of artefacts and development of exhibition concepts for permanent presentation of archaeological heritage in Visitors Centre in Dimovo;
- Procurement of the mini bus vehicle for transportation of tourists in Municipality Dimovo;
- Procurement of 10 electro bikes and 4 four-wheel bikes for the purposes of extended touristic offer at Visitors Centre Lepenski vir;
- Organisation of joint exhibition of archaeological heritage of Dimovo and Majdanpek at the Green Days festival in Sofia;

The project was successfully completed in February 2015.



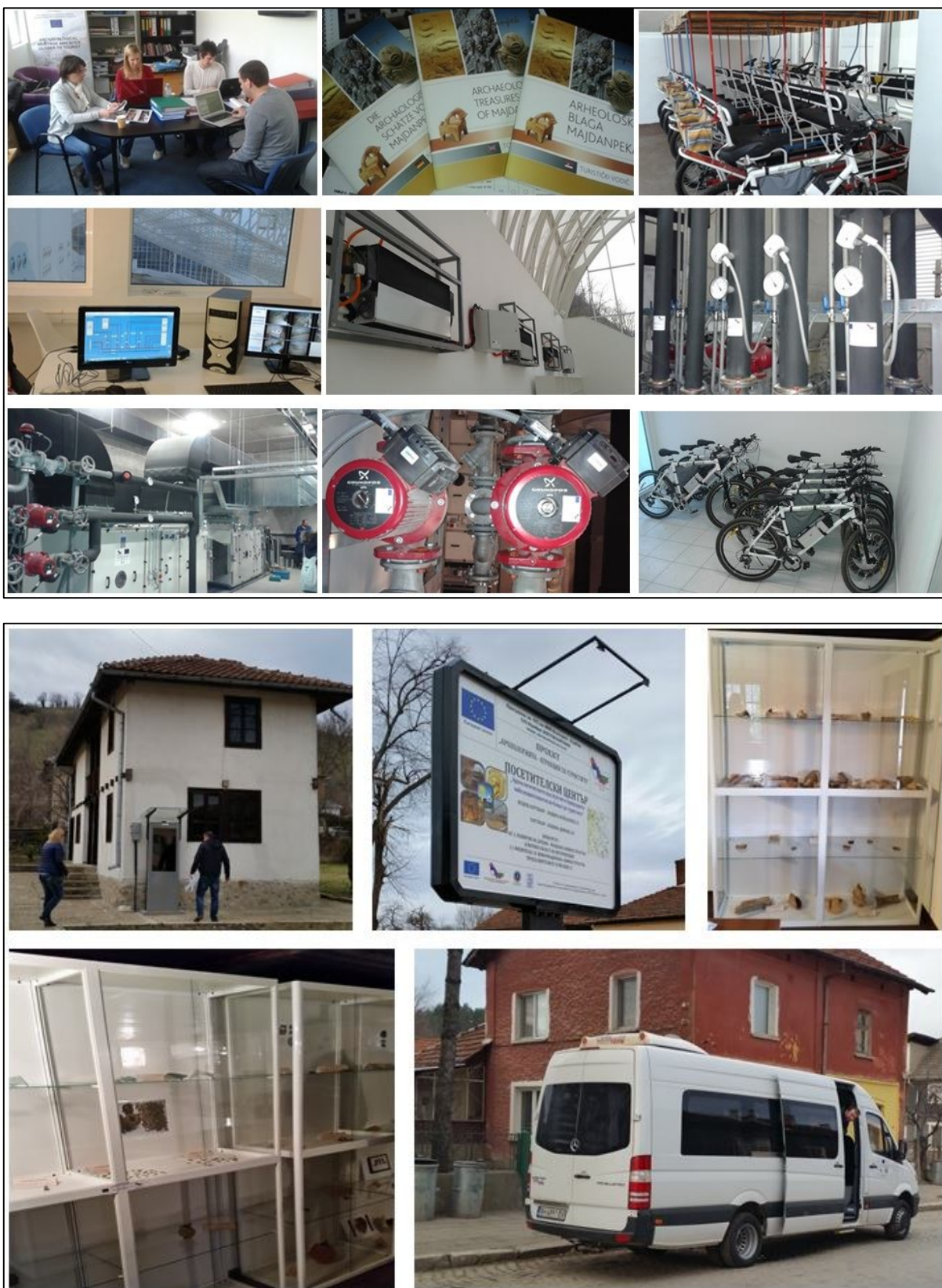

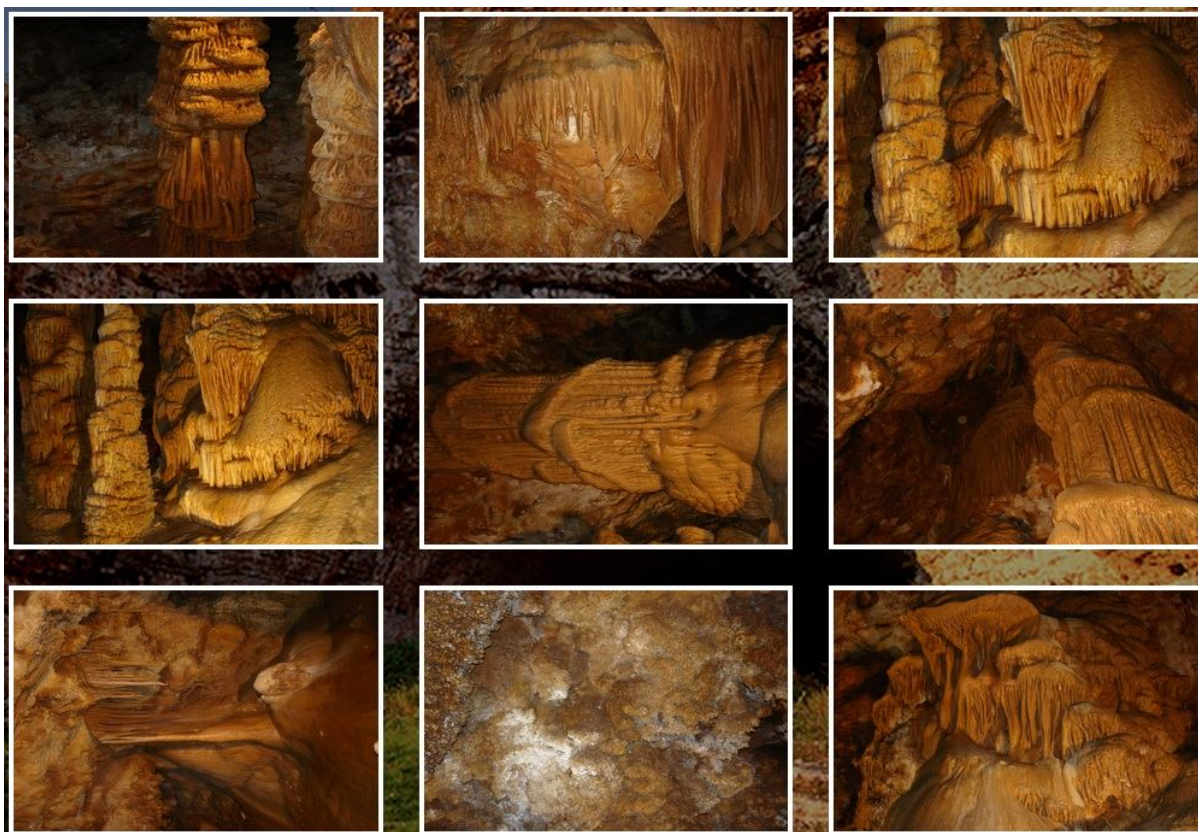
